## Art fans pick multiple Joyce

AFTER completely selling out the paintings he exhibited at the prestigious London Art Fair in January, Poole artist Peter Joyce is once again doing brisk business with his latest show at Harris Interiors in Lower Parkstone.

Indeed, one work with a £7,000-plus price tag was sold almost as soon as it went on the wall. Other

examples of Joyce's powerful landscape studies, including many smaller and more modestly priced canvases, are also attracting keen interest.

Feted by critics, collectors and dealers alike, Joyce's paintings are enjoying enormous popularity. His latest works are largely the result of his recent exploration of English Chalk landscapes, a

subject that Joyce's reputation has been built on.

This winter he spent considerable time exploring the downlands of Dorset, Wiltshire, Hampshire and Sussex. The landscape of the South Downs, and Cranborne Chase have directly informed some of his latest paintings.

The exhibition runs until April 21.
